





## Competencies and skills – health care



# Regulations/law demands related to supervision\* – social care

- The Social supervision services must ensure that there are sufficient social, legal and economic competences present, but there are no specific legal requirements. (*Denmark The National Board of Social Services*)
- Health and Social Care Act (*England Care Quality Commission*)
- Medical Treatment Epidemiological Safety Law (Latvia Health Inspectorate of Latvia)

# Regulations/law demands related to supervision\* – health care

- Organisational Act of 663 numbered governmental decree. The regulation for Inspection Board of Ministry of Helath. Other legislative documents and regulative documents. (*Turkey - Ministry of Health*)
- Health and Social Care Act (England Care Quality Commission)
- The Medical Director of Health and Public Health Act, No 41/2007 (Iceland Directorate of Health)
- Healthcare Law, Healthcare providers law, Health Insurance law (*Bulgaria Executive Agency "Medical Audit"*)
- Health Services Organization Act; Medicinal Products Act; Law Enforcement Act, Administrative Procedure Act, code of Enforcement Procedure (*Estonia Estonian Health Board*)
- Medical Treatment Law Epidemiological, Safety Law, Pharmaceutical Law (Latvia - Health Inspectorate of Latvia)
- Main one: Health Law, Inspectorate Law, other laws and Administrative Instructions (Kosovo Ministria i Shëndetësisë)

## Education activities\* – social care

- Courses in Law, inspection methods, communication, quality, safety in workplace, improvement, policies, perspectivs, such as gender equality, user perspective, research (Sweden Health and Social Care Inspectorate)
- internal training (Norway Norwegian Board of Health Supervision)
- NBSS conducts various forms of academic training. For example, teaching the supervisors using the quality model.
   One of the five social supervision units has recently, in cooperation with a university college, established two modules at the diploma level regarding respectively "Examination of educational practice" (data collection) and "Written presentation and communication". (Denmark The National Board of Social Services)
- Induction, ongoing core training programmes, conferences, team development, online learning (*England Care Quality Commission*)
- Each year approves a training plan to improve competence of inspectors, internal training in relation to new legislation (*Latvia Health Inspectorate of Latvia*)
- Laws and regulations, communication (Finland National Supervisory Authority for Welfare and Health)

## Education activities\* – health care

- Courses in Law, inspection methods, communication, quality, safety in workplace, improvement, policies, perspective, such as gender equality, user perspective, research (Sweden Health and Social Care Inspectorate)
- internal training (Norway Norwegian Board of Health Supervision)
- Once a year a training programme is carried out for all inspectors.
  Besides that some dense training programmes for assistanst inspectors during their training period.
  Those trainings mostly about investigation methods, risk assessement, general inspections, legal issues, redress of public loses (Turkey Ministry of Health)
- Induction, ongoing core training programmes, conferences, team development, online learning (*England Care Quality Commission*)
- training on specific topics of quality and safety of healthcare facilities (*Portugal The Portuguese Health Regulation Authority*)
- 1.Visiting alike institutions in other countriea. 2. Inhouse training (*Iceland Directorate of Health*)
- internal training once per year (Bulgaria Executive Agency "Medical Audit")
- on Administrative procedure, Enforcement, communication skills, IT, analysing skills (Estonia Estonian Health Board)
- Each year approves a training plan to improve competence of inspectors, internal training in relation to new legislation (Latvia Health Inspectorate of Latvia)
- administrative, medical continuous education, study visits, experts visits etc (Kosovo Ministria i Shëndetësisë)
- Laws and regulations, communication (Finland National Supervisory Authority for Welfare and Health)
- We have a decribed education programme (introduction and basis traning) for to be certificed as a supervisor (*Denmark Danish patient safety authority*)
